### When to use each:

	Behavioral Health	EAP
<b>What is it? When do I use it?</b>	<p>Long-term relationship with a provider to help with emotional health, substance abuse, depression and anxiety, and more.</p> <p>If you’ve been seeing a counselor for a long time, you will most likely be using the behavioral health benefit.</p>	<p>Short-term counseling—up to 8 visits.</p> <p>If you aren’t sure if your concern can be resolved in 8 visits, you can still use the EAP and start using your behavioral health benefits beginning at visit 9. Think of it like a test-run. You can do it without the paperwork (claims).</p>
<b>Important Notes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use your UHC ID card for behavioral health services.</li> <li>• Look for in-network providers on the UHC website</li> <li>• View your Explanations of Benefits for behavioral health alongside your medical EOB</li> <li>• Virtual visits included during the COVID-19 crisis</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dedicated EAP team with training on the unique needs of the church</li> <li>• New Number: <b>1-866-881-6800</b></li> </ul>

<b>How do I use it?</b>	<p>To find an in-network provider, log in to <b>Benefits Access &gt; Health Details &gt; Medical and Behavioral Health &gt; Click Go to UnitedHealthCare</b>. Click on <b>Find a Doctor</b>.</p> <p>If you already have a provider and they are in-network with UHC—just give them your UHC ID card. Out-of-network—you may need to submit your own claims. Go to <b>Benefits Access &gt; Health Details &gt; Medical and Behavioral Health &gt; Click Go to UnitedHealthCare</b>. Under <b>Benefits &amp; Claims</b>, select <b>Start a New Claim</b>. You can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Complete the requested information and submit your claim online OR</li><li>• Download and print a paper claim form and mail to: Claims Processing P.O. Box 30755 Salt Lake City, UT 84130-0755</li></ul>	<p>Call <b>1-866-881-6800</b>.</p>
<b>How much do I pay?</b>	<p>It depends on which HealthFlex plan you are enrolled in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>B1000</b>—\$15 for an outpatient visit</li><li>• <b>HRA plan</b>—coinsurance; don't have to meet the deductible first</li><li>• <b>HSA plan</b>—full discounted rate until you meet the deductible (IRS rules!) and then coinsurance percentage</li></ul>	<p>Nothing. 8 free visits, in-person or virtual, per concern, per year.</p>
<b>With everything going on with COVID-19, can I talk to someone virtually?</b>	<p>Yes! If your provider is willing to provide virtual counseling, UHC will currently allow it during this public health crisis.</p>	<p>Your 8 visits include virtual visits with an EAP counselor!</p>
<b>Is there a difference if I select an in-network vs. out-of-network provider?</b>	<p>Yes. First, you may also pay a lower fee for an in-network provider if you are in an HRA or HSA plan. Also, if you choose a provider in-network with UHC, the provider will submit claims directly to UHC. If not in-network, you'll need to submit your claims directly via the instructions above.</p> <p>Note—each claim must be submitted separately.</p>	<p>EAP always uses an in-network provider. Call to get authorization [By phone 24/7: <b>1-866-881-6800</b> or log in to <b>Benefits Access</b>, click on <b>Well-Being</b>, then <b>EAP</b> (log in with your Optum HealthSafe ID). You will be able to log in via SSO after entering your user name and password for future log ins. If you end up using the provider for more than 8 visits, you'll use the process to the left.</p>
