**GENERAL CHURCH
APPORTIONMENTS**

A. World Service Fund \$1,318,214

Our share of the essential core of the global outreach ministry of The United Methodist Church. This worldwide outreach supports missionaries, builds and strengthens churches and brings the saving grace and healing of Christ to persons worldwide that a local church could not do alone. Provides funds for resources for our churches in evangelism, youth ministries, education, stewardship and other ministries.

B. Ministerial Education Fund \$445,231

Supports the education of tomorrow's ministers in our 13 UM seminaries. One-fourth of the amount remains in our Conference under the administration of the Board of Ordained Ministry for seminary scholarships and loans.

C. Black Colleges Fund \$177,599

Assists funding of the eleven predominantly African-American colleges. These colleges are open to students regardless of racial origin.

D. Africa University \$39,746

In Zimbabwe, we are now funding the first UM university in Africa. This university educates Africans to be ministers, teachers, healers and leaders for Africans.

E. Episcopal Fund \$582,067

Support for active and retired bishops and for the ministry of the Council of Bishops.

F. General Administration \$156,527

Underwrites the work of the General Conference, administration of the finances of the denomination and the safeguarding of the legal interests and assets, maintains denominational record.

G. Interdenominational Cooperation \$34,820

Nurtures the ministries of churches uniting in Christ, the World Methodist Council, the Commission on Pan-Methodist Cooperation

Includes keeping the vision of ethnic local church concerns before the annual conference; coordinating strategies related to ethnic local church concerns; providing a forum for dialogue; training and interpretation.	
E. Global Ministries	\$18,000
Includes planning and promoting meetings and experiences throughout the conference to develop a spirit of mission and participation in global ministries; engaging in direct ministries to human need, both emergency and ongoing; working in all capacities with the General Board of Global Ministries.

CENTER FOR CONNECTIONAL RESOURCES

Responsible for providing the necessary services to leverage our resources and support our efforts to address the priorities of the Annual Conference. Includes the central treasury, clergy and staff benefits, property concerns including the conference-wide property & liability insurance program, administrative support services, and camp and retreat center operations.

Covers the cost of operations of the Treasurer’s office, administrative services in the Ministry Center, Annual Conference, and The Journal.

SECOND MILE GIVING

In addition to supporting conference and general church apportionments, each United Methodist has the opportunity to make gifts to specific ministries. One-hundred percent of your gifts to these designated giving opportunities go to the selected project. No administrative costs are deducted.
