

FREE AND FAIR ELECTIONS RESOURCES

[Ballot Ready](#) from Texas Impact – enter your address to check your voter registration, see your elected and appointed officials, research your ballot, and get ready to participate in the next election.

[VoteTexas](#) from the Texas Secretary of State - provide basic information required to vote such as last day to register for the next election, check an individual's voter registration status, polling place, etc.

[Vote411.org](#) - a "one-stop-shop" for election related information. It provides nonpartisan information to the public with both general and state-specific information on the following aspects of the election process:

- Absentee ballot information
- Ballot measure information (where applicable)
- Early voting options (where applicable)
- Election dates
- Factual data on candidates in various federal, state and local races
- General information on such topics as how to watch debates with a critical eye
- ID requirements
- Polling place locations
- Registration deadlines
- Voter qualifications
- Voter registration forms
- Voting machines

[Work Elections](#) – connect with your county to become a poll worker: checking in voters, answering their questions, setting up and testing voting machines, issuing ballots, etc.
