

WHAT IS LAY SERVANT MINISTRIES?

Lay Servant Ministries is a long-standing program of the United Methodist Church which helps laity to recognize and use their spiritual gifts so that the missions and purpose of the church may be carried out. The program equips and encourages laity to serve in a variety of roles in partnership with their pastors. Within the church, lay servants may provide assistance, leadership, and support in preaching, teaching, and specialized ministry programs. Outside the church, lay servants may minister to community members in need such as the poor, the sick, or the incarcerated. The Methodist Church was built on laity service and 99.2% of the church is currently laity. In the earliest days of the Methodist movement, lay preachers were known as “exhorters” who provided pulpit supply for absent pastors. In 1956, the term “lay speaker” replaced “exhorter.” By 1992, the church recognized that laity did much more than public speaking, and expanded the role to include ministries of leading, caring and communicating. At the 2012 General Conference of the United Methodist Church, the name was changed from “Lay Speaking Ministries” to “Lay Servant Ministries.”

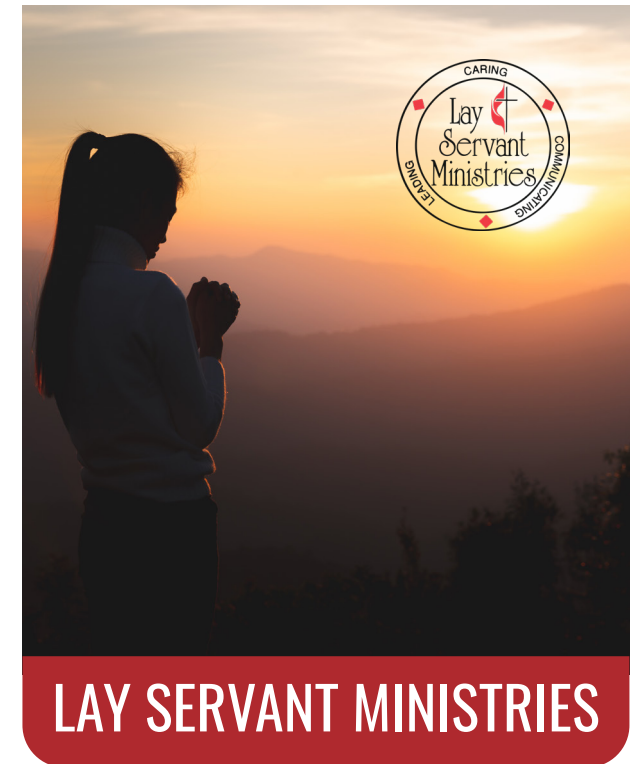

- Certified Lay Speakers
- Certified Lay Ministers

All Lay Servants may serve the local church and beyond by preaching, teaching, leading, supporting specialized ministry programs, and conducting meetings for prayer, study, and discussion.
