She also served as the Minister to Children and Families at FUMC, Colorado Springs for over 20 years.

She has authored several books including *Touching Heaven: real stories of life, children and eternity,* and has received several awards including *The 2011 AspenPoint Mental Health Worker of the Year or Colorado Springs, The Good Samaritan Award, the Micah Award,* the *Dove of Peace award and the Lohman Award* in recognition of her pioneering work in Holy Listening: wholistic mental health care from a spiritual perspective.

Leanne has worked nationally and internationally as a consultant, speaker, University Professor, writer and mentor dedicating herself to helping congregations and organizations strengthen, develop, expand, deepen and create holistic ministries within and beyond the church walls.
