Homer Noel Bryant

The Rev. H. Noel Bryant was born on September 26, 1913 in Hereford, Texas and went home to the Lord on January 3, 2011. There he joined his devoted wife of 71 years, Frances Marie, who had passed away just days before on December 30, 2010.

A graduate of McMurry University and Perkins School of Theology at SMU, he started his ministry of 47 years in the Northwest Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church in 1937. He was appointed to serve churches in Lamesa, Ralls, Wellington, and Borger. In Borger, he led the building of a new church sanctuary for First Methodist Church in the early 1950s. In 1954, he and Frances Marie moved to the Oak Cliff United Methodist Church in Dallas and remained a long-time resident of the Dallas area, serving as a minister and District Superintendent in the North Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church. He was appointed to churches in Dallas, Denton, and Sherman; served as District Superintendent in Wichita Falls; was Director of the North Texas Conference Council; and he completed his ministry in 1984 as District Superintendent of the Sherman-McKinney district.

During his retirement, he taught the Fellowship Class at University Park UMC and served twice on the faculty of the Intern Program at SMU's Perkins School of Theology. He was a member of Rotary International and served as President of the Denton Rotary Club in 1963-64.

He is survived by children: Sylvia and Dan Ostos, Darlyne and Steve Bryant, and Karen and Stan Bryant; five grandchildren: Brent Ostos, Stephanie Mitchess, Michael Ostos, Tamara Bean, Jennifer Bryant; and eight great-grandchildren.

A service celebrating the lives of Noel and Frances Marie was held at University Park UMC in Dallas on January 4, 2011.



Eldon M. Chester

Rev. Eldon M. Chester, a United Methodist church pastor for over 40 years, passed away on September 9, 2010 at the age of 82. He was born October 7, 1927 in Beaumont, Texas to Eldon M. Chester, Jr. and Mary West Chester. He is preceded in death by parents and brother, James West Chester.

He attended public school in Beaumont, graduated from high school in 1946 and then enrolled in Lon Morris College in Jacksonville. While at Lon Morris, Eldon met the former Bobbye Simmons, and the two were married upon graduation from Lon Morris on June 20, 1948.

Eldon worked for Gray Bar Electric Company and Westinghouse Appliance in Houston until moving to Denison, Texas in 1957. While in Denison, he worked at KXII-TV as a news and weather reporter. The Chester's were active in their church laity program, an avenue that eventually led to Rev. Chester serving as a lay pastor while beginning his liturgical studies at SMU Perkins School of Theology. He served on staff at Waples UMC in Denison under his mentor Dr. Walter Underwood and went on to local pastorships at Pottsboro-Cedar-Southmayd UMC and Imperial Heights UMC in Denison. Rev. Chester again joined Dr. Underwood as an associate pastor at First UMC in Wichita Falls, followed by an associate's position at First UMC in Hurst. He received his Deacon ordination from SMU in 1975 and then began his career as a full-time senior pastor at churches in Como-Pickton, Forney, Jacksboro, Wesley UMC in Greenville, St. Paul's UMC in Garland, First UMC Lone Oak, and finally at First UMC Wolfe City from which he retired in 1993.



Chester's wife Bobbye was a partner in ministry as an active member of the UMW, serving as an officer in various positions at both the local and conference level. Bobbye would join Eldon in Eternal Life when she passed away two months after Eldon. They are survived by sons and daughters-in law Chuck and Debbie Chester of Flower Mound, Bill and Tina Chester of The Woodlands and Andy and Kim Chester of Waxahachie; daughters and sons-in-law Cathy and Gifford Long of Grand Prairie and Janie and Barney Gulley of Palacios; twelve grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. A memorial service led by Eldon's son-in-law, Rev. Gifford Long, was held on September 12, 2010 at First UMC, Grand Prairie.

Chief Ashley Warden

The Rev. Chief Warden, 91, of Wolfe City passed away on December 22, 2010 in Hunt Regional Medical Center of Greenville. Rev. Warden was born September 22, 1919, in McKinney to Hezekiah and Margaret Eskew Warden. He attended high school in Abilene and attended Midwestern University in Wichita Falls. On May 28, 1944 he married Betty Jean Branton in Cisco.

From 1943 to 1953 Chief served churches in Central Texas Conference as a local pastor. He was ordained an elder in full connection in 1956 and came to the North Texas Conference where he served at Cedar Hill UMC, First UMC, Rockwall, First UMC, Gainesville, First UMC, McKinney, Wesley UMC in Greenville, First UMC, Bonham and First UMC, Cooper. Rev. Warden retired in 1985.

Chief's wife, Betty, passed away on August 13, 2010. He is survived by his daughter Beth Caywood and husband Stan of Wolfe City; son Gary Warden of Irving; granddaughters Courtney Caywood Allen and husband Blake and Heather Caywood Hamilton and husband James; four great-grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews. Services were held at First UMC Wolfe City on December 27, 2010.



Lovell Rowena Wright Baker

Lovell Baker passed away on June 27, 2010 at the age of 94. She was born in Pauls Valley, Oklahoma, the daughter of a Methodist minister. She gave her life to the Lord at the age of nine and devoted her life to her family, friends and to serving the Lord.

Lovell graduated valedictorian of her high school class and obtained her Bachelor's degree with highest honors from Oklahoma Women's University. She attended Northwestern University where she earned her Master's degree in both religious studies and music. She served as Director of Music and Director of Christian Education in Methodist churches in Iowa, Alabama, Oklahoma, and Texas. In high school she began reviewing books which led to a part-time career as a professional book reviewer. A talented musician, she sang and played the piano, which caught the eye of a certain Dr. George Baker, who proposed after two years of courtship. They moved to Dallas in 1948 to a home in which Lovell lived until the day she died.

Dr. Baker, the love of her life, was University Chaplain then professor of Homiletics at SMU's Perkins School of Theology. He died in 1974, and Lovell lived 36 years as a widow. During their marriage, they loved to sing together and put on entertainment shows for church groups, often featuring their four children in song, dance, and comedy skits. She loved gardening and her backyard was once featured in "Better Homes and Gardens" magazine. She was in "Who's Who of American Women and nominated for "most influential and outstanding woman in Dallas."



Lovell is survived by three sons; Dr. George Baker, Dr. Merrimon Baker and Randolph Baker; her daughter, Jeannine and two grandchildren, Paige and Evan Baker. Her memorial service was held on July 3, 2010 at University Park UMC, Dallas. When she stands before the Lord Jesus, He will gaze upon her and say, "Well done, well done."

Frances Marie Church Bryant

Frances Marie Bryant was born October 17, 1915 in Merkel, Texas and died on December 30, 2010 in Kerrville, Texas. She was a graduate of McMurry University in Abilene, Texas and taught English and Speech in Merkel and Borger in the 1930s and 1940s.

After her marriage in 1939 to Rev. Homer Noel Bryant, she assisted her husband's ministry in several Texas Methodist churches. In 1954, she and her family moved to Dallas where her husband served at the Oak Cliff UMC. In addition to helping her husband's ministry at churches in Denton and Sherman, she also worked at administrative positions in the North Texas Methodist Conference office and Sherman District. After Noel's retirement in 1984, she continued to work as a substitute teacher in the Dallas public schools. She had numerous interests, including working with ceramics, growing houseplants, playing dominoes and "42", giving book reviews, cooking, entertaining, and taking trips to Estes Park, Colorado. She also kept up with family and friends to whom she was known as "Mother B." She was a lifetime member of the UMW, holding numerous positions in it as well as in the Fellowship Class at University Park UMC.

Noel, her devoted husband of 71 years, joined her in Heaven a few days later, on January 3, 2011. Bobbye Simmons Chester

Bobbye Chester, devoted pastor's wife, mother and active United Methodist Women's officer, died on November 21, 2010 at the age of 82. She was born on February 19, 1928 in Liberty Hill to William and Gladys Simmons. She is preceded in death by her husband of 62 years, The Rev. Eldon M. Chester, parents, sisters Wilma Jennings and Mary Helen Thornton and brother William "Glenn" Simmons.

She attended Llano and Palestine public schools and while at Lon Morris College in Jacksonville, she met and married Eldon M. Chester on June 20, 1948. A life-long advocate for women and children, she taught and led by example through numerous Schools of Mission and biblical studies. She served in a variety of UMW local, district and conference officer roles for over 40 years during the Chester's ministry at Denison Waples UMC, Pottsboro-Cedar-Southmayd UMC churches, Denison Imperial Heights UMC, FUMC in Wichita Falls, Hurst, Como-Pickton, Forney, Jacksboro, Greenville Wesley UMC, Garland St. Paul's UMC, First UMC Lone Oak, and FUMC Wolfe City from which they retired in 1993

Whitty Cuninggim

Whitty Cuninggim, author, long-time advocate of the Women's League of Voters, and wife of Rev. Merrimon Cuninggim, past dean of the Perkins School of Theology passed away on November 2, 2010.

Whitty's interest in the rights of others in government is reflected in her lifelong participation in The League of Women Voters. Whitty joined the Dallas League in the 1950's. Asked why she joined the League, she said, "At the time, I was looking for an objective discussion in government matters and I saw that the League of Women Voters offered a fairer choice debate that included women's issues." She has been lauded in Baltimore County for improving educational facilities, elimination of child labor and improved election laws.

Whitty wrote two books on volunteerism in the public schools and co-wrote another. One of Whitty's children said, "I can say for sure she had great respect for the League and its mission and she has always been a loyal supporter of its work and its commitment to advocating for the best of democratic values and allowing varied perspectives on important national political issues to be heard through a collective female voice. She believed one should be deeply committed to one's community and found like minds and hearts in the League."

She is survived by two daughters, Lee Neff and Penny Cuninggim and several grandchildren and great-grandchildren. A memorial service was held on December 4, 2010 at the Broadmead Retirement Community in Cockeysville, MD.



Oma Lee Davis Davenport

Oma Lee Davenport was born on December 23, 1923 in Olney, Texas, the daughter of the late William and Mary Cox Davis. Oma's husband, Rev. Allie Davenport, says that Oma Lee had a given name, but that her father named her Oma Lee after he saw the name on a feed sack. He said that she wouldn't have responded to any other name.

Oma Lee graduated from North Texas State Teachers College in 1943 and taught Home Economics and Life Science for the Dallas ISD for many years before retiring in 1970. On September 24, 1944 she married Allie M. Davenport, Jr. in Wichita Falls. Oma Lee enjoyed writing poetry and was an avid cook who liked to create new recipes. She was a member of King Memorial United Methodist Church in Whitney. Oma Lee was an active participant in the life of every church where she and her husband served. She was known for her innovative and creative programs: even dressing like characters such as Minnie Pearl. She taught and wrote a program for UMW called "The Five Spiritual Classics."
