

Take Action for Free and Fair Elections

1. Make sure you are registered to vote.
 - Even if you have registered in the past, purges do occur. [Click here](#) to make sure you are ready to vote!
 - If you are not registered, the registration deadline for the next election is October 11.
2. Help others register to vote.
 - Sharing election information on social media can help raise awareness of registration deadlines, as well as how and where to register.

3. Make your voting plan and help others do the same.

The process of voting can be confusing – where do I go? What ID do I need to bring? What are we even voting on? And just like so many other aspects of our lives, the accountability of sharing your plan with a friend and ensuring they have a plan to participate can make the difference.
4. Work the polls.

It takes roughly 50,000 people to run an election in Texas. Connect with your county to see how you could serve as a poll worker. Opportunities are also available for students 16 years old and older to serve as election clerks.
