"White Fragility is a state in which even a minimum amount of racial stress becomes intolerable, triggering a range of defensive moves. These moves include the outward display of emotions such as anger, fear, and guilt, and behaviors such as argumentation, silence, and leaving the stressinducing situation. These behaviors, in turn, function to reinstate white racial equilibrium." - Robin DiAngelo¹

Why does it matter?

- It is very difficult for white people to even speak of race, which prevents progress on racial justice in church, the workplace, and the world
- Need to move beyond getting stuck in unhelpful thinking about racism as only something bad racist people do, when it's really a much broader system that affects people of goodwill
- It is important for white Christians to do their own homework with regard to racism and white supremacy, and not force persons of color to do all the work of confronting and teaching them

Why it matters in local churches?

- Equips for living into baptismal covenant
- Helps church achieve its mission of making disciples in a racially charged environment
- Reveals an essential facet of salvation and the redemption of the world from evil
- Gives disciples tools to be influential
 wherever they find themselves in the
 world
- People are struggling to find helpful language and ways of understanding race and how they and their families figure into the systems of race
