- Immanuel Korean United Methodist Mission. Constituted on March 21, 2021, IKUMC will be taking over the facilities of the recently closed Webb Chapel UMC. There are many challenges and opportunities ahead for IKUMC and their pastor, Rev. Sungchol Kwon.

In the corner of my dining room, right behind my Covid-19 workstation, we have a beautiful Madagascar Dragon Tree.
